




## PHONEBOOK WITHOUT PHONE NUMBERS

## You see a “suspicious” figure

Think about why they look “suspicious.” Have they actually done anything alarming? A lot of us are taught that someone can be “suspicious” just for the way they look. Where did you get those messages? Why do these views exist?

If you are concerned about their safety, ask them if they are okay. Make the best decision you can after you get as much information as you can. Think about the safest possible outcome for the most vulnerable person in the situation.

# KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

## WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE STOPPED BY POLICE, IMMIGRATION AGENTS, OR THE FBI

- Stay calm. Don't run. Don't argue, resist or obstruct the police, even if you are innocent or police are violating your rights. Keep your hands where police can see them.
- Ask if you are free to leave. If the officer says yes, calmly and silently walk away. If you are under arrest, you have a right to know why.
- You have the right to remain silent and cannot be punished for refusing to answer questions. If you wish to remain silent, tell the officer out loud. In Iowa, there is no law requiring you to give your name if you are asked to identify yourself during a temporary stop.
- But police do not always follow the law, and refusing to give your name may make them suspicious, so use your judgment. If you fear that your name may be incriminating, you can claim the right to remain silent, and if you are arrested, this may help you later. Do not give a false or fictitious name.
- You do not have to consent to a search of yourself or your belongings, but police may "pat down" your clothing if they suspect a weapon. You should not physically resist, but you have the right to refuse consent for any further search.
- If you agree to an interview, have a lawyer present. You do not have to answer any questions you feel uncomfortable answering, and can say that you will only answer questions on a specific topic.


## QUÉ DEBE HACER SI LA POLICÍA, AGENTES DE INMIGRACIÓN O EL FBI LO DETIENEN

- Tiene derecho a permanecer en silencio. No se lo puede castigar por negarse a contestar preguntas. Si desea permanecer en silencio, dígaselo al oficial en voz alta. En Iowa, la ley no le obliga a usted a facilitar su nombre si se le pide identificarse durante una detención rutinaria.
- Sin embargo, la policía no siempre cumple con esta ley, y si usted se niega a dar su nombre podría resultar sospechoso, de modo que reflexione cómo actuar en cada caso. Si teme que su nombre pueda incriminarle, puede invocar su derecho a permanecer en silencio. En caso de ser arrestado, esto podría ayudarlo más adelante. No dé nombres falsos o inventados.
- No está obligado a consentir a un registro de su persona o de sus pertenencias. Sin embargo, la policía puede registrarle la ropa si sospechan que tiene un arma. No oponga resistencia física, pero tiene derecho a no consentir a más registros. Consentir a un registro le podría perjudicar más adelante ante un tribunal.

Globally, this visual alphabet is used to accentuate and emphasize emotional meaning over text communication. Across cultures, meaning can get lost as the charming images take on subversive interpretations. Context is needed to fully appreciate these types of usages. In the following charts, we provide an entry into conversing in emoji. We invite and encourage you to experiment, redevelop, push the envelope, and create your own symbolism within your own tribe.
